LATEST COVID-19 UPDATES:

• Testing in the Derbyshire Dales

Between 6 July 2022 and 12 July 2022, there have been 1,737 tests. This shows a decrease of -5.4% compared to the previous 7 days.

• Cases in Derbyshire Dales

Between 2 July 2022 and 8 July 2022, 11 people had a confirmed positive test result. This shows a decrease of -31.2% compared to the previous 7 days.

• Vaccinations in Derbyshire Dales

61,635 given a first dose by the end of 12 July 2022.
60,053 given a second dose by the end of 12 July 2022.
52,485 given a booster or third dose by the end of 12 July 2022.

• Healthcare in Chesterfield Royal Hospital NHS Foundation Trust

Between 4 July 2022 and 10 July 2022, 114 went into hospital with coronavirus. This shows an increase of 185.0% compared to the previous 7 days. There were 104 patients in hospital with coronavirus on 12 July 2022.

• Deaths in Derbyshire Dales

Between 2 July 2022 and 8 July 2022, there have been 1 deaths within 28 days of a positive coronavirus test.

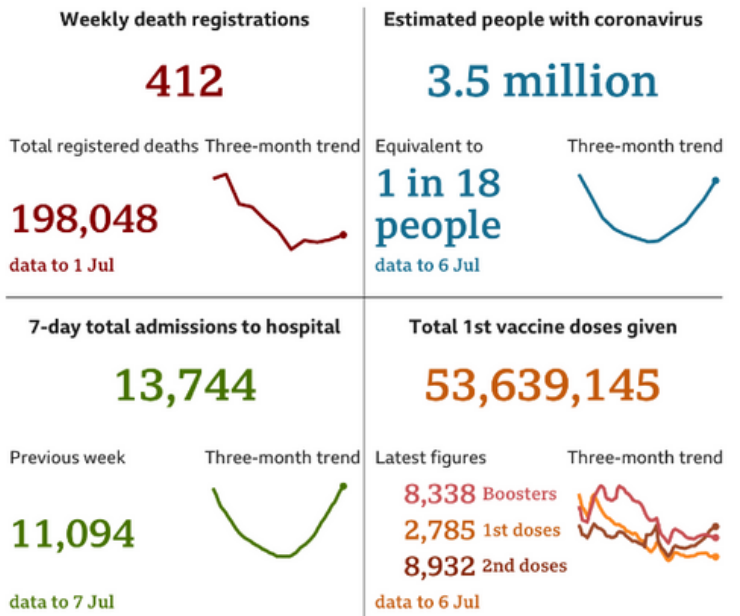


Over 50s to be offered COVID-19 booster and flu jab this autumn. Everyone aged 50 and over will be among those offered a COVID-19 booster and a flu jab this autumn under plans to increase protection against respiratory viruses ahead of winter.

The Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) has now published its final recommendations for this autumn's programme. Under the advice, those eligible for a further dose will be:

- all adults aged 50 years and over
- those aged 5 to 49 years in a clinical risk group, including pregnant women
- those aged 5 to 49 years who are household contacts of people with immunosuppression
- those aged 16 to 49 years who are carers
- residents in a care home for older adults and staff working in care homes for older adults
- frontline health and social care workers

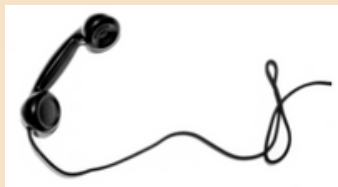
